**ATTENDING VETERINARIAN AND ADEQUATE VETERINARY CARE (DEALERS AND EXHIBITORS).**

Section 2.40(b)(3) Each exhibitor shall establish and maintain programs of adequate veterinary care that include daily observation of all animals to assess their health and well-being with direct and frequent communication on problems of animal health, behavior and well-being conveyed to the attending veterinarian in a timely manner.

(1) The older coatimundi male has hair loss on its tail, lower back and flank areas. There is also an open sore on its lower back just above the base of the tail. This animal needs to be brought to the attention of the attending veterinarian for evaluation and treatment to ensure its health and well-being.

(2) The North American male porcupine has over grown front teeth. The teeth need to be trimmed to prevent problems with its mouth and eating.

(3) The female fennec fox has hair loss and some scabs on it sides. The exhibitor said the animal has been evaluated by the veterinarian, but there were no available records. The exhibitor needs records for the animal to show its received adequate veterinary care.

**FEEDING.**

Section 3.82(a) Feeding: The diet for nonhuman primates must be of sufficient nutritive value to meet its normal daily nutritional requirements.

The monkey biscuits with the microencapsulated vitamin C are considered to be nutritious for six months from the milling date. There are two bags of food with a milling date beyond 6 months: September 20, 2004. This food is not considered to be of sufficient nutritive value to meet the daily nutritional requirements of the nonhuman primates and needs to be discarded. New monkey biscuits must be obtained.

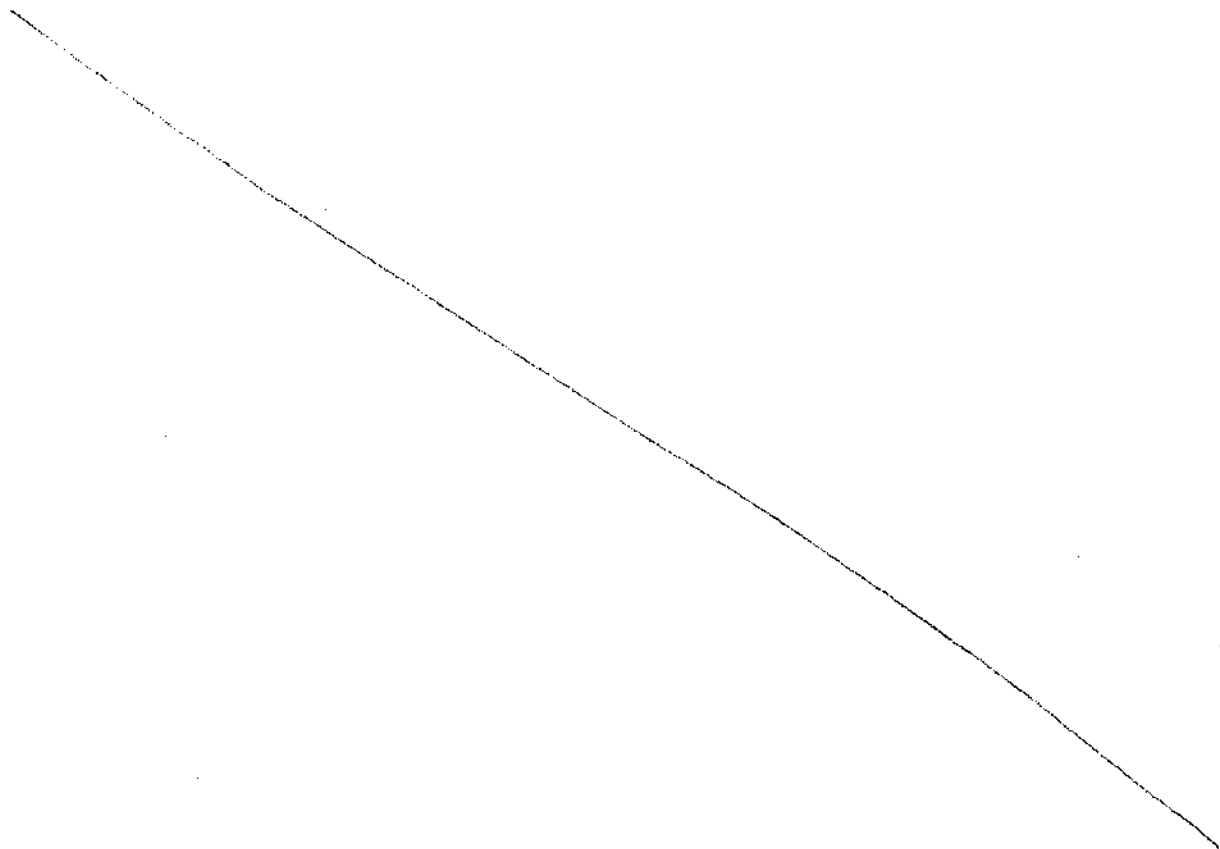
**SANITATION.**

Section 3.131(c) Housekeeping: Premises must be kept clean and in good repair in order to protect the animals from injury and to facilitate the prescribed husbandry practices set forth in this subpart.

(1) The ground in front of the lion holding area has hair and debris from washing down the holding area. Numerous insects were on the ground and flying above the area. The hair and debris need to be removed from the ground so not to attract insect pests.

(2) The laboratory/pharmacy area has dirt and dead insects on the window sills and dirt on the table, counter and floor. This room needs to be cleaned and maintained in a clean state to be an appropriate laboratory/pharmacy area.
