PRIMARY ENCLOSURES.

<< (a) General requirements.

(2) Primary enclosures must be constructed and maintained so that they:

(i) Have no sharp points or edges that could injure the nonhuman primates;>>

**The enclosure housing two red-ruffed lemurs had a feeder lined with small plastic mesh. The mesh was broken in several places and had sharp ends, posing a risk of injury to the animals.

**The night housing for four ring-tailed lemurs had broken wire mesh in the floor of the southwest enclosure that had sharp points and had at least one hole that was large enough to pose a risk of injury to a foot or leg.

**The enclosure housing 2 pileated gibbons had a wooden perch in the northeast corner that was in disrepair and had at least 2 wires with sharp ends protruding, posing a risk of injury to the animals.

**The enclosure housing 3 pileated gibbons had a rusted wire with sharp ends protruding into the enclosure on the southeast corner near a cross-support pole which poses a risk of injury to these animals.

**The enclosure housing a single male DeBrazza's monkey had a wire for a perch with sharp edges protruding in the southeast corner of the enclosure, posing a risk of injury to the animal.

Enclosures shall be maintained in good repair so that there are no sharp edges and to ensure that animals are protected from injury.

FEEDING.

<< (b) Food, and food receptacles, if used, shall be sufficient in quantity and located so as to be accessible to all animals in the enclosure and shall be placed so as to minimize contamination. >>

Several animals were being fed on the ground in a manner that did not minimize contamination.

**Animals in the petting zoo (1 llama, 14 goats, 5 Axis deer) were being fed on the ground where there was an accumulation of feces and the animals can walk through the feed, causing contamination and posing a risk to their health.

**A group of 11 Addax had a mineral supplement block placed directly on the ground surrounded by fecal matter and posing a risk of contamination of this feed supplement.

**A male zebra is being fed directly on the ground, posing a risk of contamination by fecal matter.

Food shall be placed so as to minimize contamination to protect the health of the animals.

First prelicense inspection conducted. Applicant is aware that no regulated activities may be conducted until all items are in compliance with the AWA regulations and standards. Accompanied on the inspection by facility representatives and AC VMO. Exit interview conducted on site on 9/6/2013 with facility representatives.
